

# Drug & Alcohol Individual Tests & Pricing

## Workforce Pro Lab Screening

These individual drug and alcohol tests are commonly used for workplace, court-ordered, DOT, and personal screening purposes. Testing is conducted using established chain-of-custody and laboratory procedures when required.

### Rapid Drug Screen (5-Panel) — \$49

Quick qualitative screening for commonly abused substances. Often used for non-DOT workplace or personal screening.

### Rapid Drug Screen (10-Panel) — \$49

Expanded rapid screening covering additional drug classes. Provides preliminary results.

### Urine Drug Test (4–10 Panel) — Starting at \$59

Laboratory-based urine drug testing with confirmation when required. Commonly used for employment and compliance testing.

### Hair Drug Test — Starting at \$169

Provides a longer detection window than urine testing. Often used to assess historical drug use patterns.

### Nail Drug Test — Starting at \$229

Another extended detection option for identifying historical drug exposure when urine testing is not sufficient.

### Alcohol Breath Test (BAT) — \$45

Measures current alcohol concentration using breath analysis. Commonly used for workplace and compliance screening.

### EtG Alcohol Test (Urine) — \$89

Detects alcohol metabolites to assess recent alcohol consumption beyond immediate intoxication.

### PEth Alcohol Test (Blood) — \$299

Measures a direct alcohol biomarker that may reflect alcohol use over a longer timeframe (often weeks).

### Drug-Facilitated Sexual Assault (DFSA) Panel — \$149

Screens for certain substances commonly associated with drug-facilitated sexual assault cases.

### Xylazine (Tranq) Urine Test — \$209

Detects exposure to xylazine, a veterinary sedative increasingly found in some illicit drug supplies.
